Course Description

In this course, students will examine concepts that represent the true nature of science, as designed by the AZ Department of Education. Students will first develop skills in Inquiry Processing which will create a foundation for learning and executing scientific standards. The history and social influence of science will be discussed and explored. Students will then expand their knowledge in the content of Life, Earth, and Space Sciences.

Course Competencies/Learning Objectives

Students who successfully complete 8th Grade Science will be competent in the following areas:

- Inquiry Process
- History and Nature of Science
- Science in Personal and Social Perspectives
- Life Science
- Earth & Space Science

Materials

Students will be expected to come to class prepared with a pencil daily. In addition, students will need to purchase a hard-covered composition notebook that will be used every day in Science class. This notebook will be collected periodically for a grade, so it must not get lost or damaged.

Attendance

Attendance is vital to academic success. We expect students to attend school every day so that they will have the greatest opportunity to have a successful academic year. A student who has 10 absences (excused or unexcused) from a class within a semester may be withdrawn from the class. The student may lose the credit for that class, but may recover the credit by taking the class on-line or in a traditional class setting the following school year.

Tardies

Students are encouraged and expected to be in their class on time. A tardy is defined as “not being in an assigned seat when the bell rings”. If a student is tardy six or more times in a six week period, he/she will be assigned to Behavior Intervention Program (BIP) by administration.

Grades and Scale

Below 60% is considered "Incomplete". An "Incomplete" signifies that a student has not mastered the essential standards or requirements of the course and may be required to retake it.

- Class participation & Attendance: 5%
- Homework: 5%
- Projects, Papers & Labs: 30%
- Classwork: 20%
- Quizzes & Tests: 20%
- Final Class Exam: 20%

Classroom Expectations

1. Arrive to class on time, sit in assigned seat, and be ready to learn.
2. Participate in all assignments, group work, projects, etc.
3. Respect classroom equipment, materials, each other, and teachers.
4. Be responsible for completing missed assignments, seeking assistance when needed, and checking your grades.
5. No electronic devices are to be used in class unless instructor gives permission for instructional purposes.

Late & Missing Assignments

Students will be responsible for completing all assigned coursework by the established due date. Students will be given appropriate time to complete most assignments and projects in class, however, students may be asked to complete their work as homework. Quizzes and exams must be completed in class and if needed, makeups can be scheduled.

- Students will be given the opportunity to complete missed assignments for 70% of the deserved grade for up to two weeks after the initial due date.
- After two weeks, students will receive 40% of the allowed assignment grade for up to 9 missing assignments.
- 10 or more missing assignments in one class will receive 0% credit and an intervention will take place.

Online Grade Book

Parents and students should monitor grades regularly by accessing the online grade book, PowerSchool. Parents will be assigned a confidential access code to PowerSchool that will allow them to see their child's grades, assignments, and attendance in each class. To take advantage of this powerful tool, parents should go to <http://edkey.powerschool.com> and enter their ID and password. You can receive your ID and password from the front office.

Tutoring

It is possible, at any time of the year, that a student may need extra help in my class. I will be contacting students and their parents if I feel that the student will benefit from extra tutoring. Tutoring appointments will be set up before and after school. Parents, if you feel your student needs extra help for my class, please do not hesitate to request tutoring.
